

Common shiner (*Notropis cornutus*)
Relatively stout, silvery, and has a large mouth and triangular head.



Emerald shiner (*Notropis atherinoides*)
The slender, fragile-looking body, large eye, and blue-green or green iridescent back of the emerald shiner set it apart from other shiners.



Blacknose shiner (*Notropis heterolepis*)
Stout body, with a bulging abdomen and a dark lateral band which extends across the body and to the snout.



Spottail shiner (*Notropis hudsonius*)
A black spot on the tail is one of the few characteristics which distinguish the spottail from the blacknose.




Golden shiner (*Notemigonus crysoleucas*)
Readily identified by its over-all golden hue, deep triangular-shaped body, and small pointed head.



Northern redbelly dace (*Chrosomus eos*)
Can be distinguished from other minnows by a distinct dark lateral band separating their dark, almost black backs from their lighter bellies.




Finescale dace (*Chrosomus neogaeus*)
Dark brown back, with an olive-green or gold lateral stripe above a distinct lateral band which runs across the body, through the eye, and ends in a caudal spot.



Pearl dace (*Semotilus margarita*)
Dusky-silver, with slightly larger scales. Elongated and tubular in shape.



Creek chub (*Semotilus atromaculatus*)
A black spot at the beginning of the dorsal fin distinguishes this minnow from other baitfish.




Lake chub (*Couesius plumbeus*)
Slender body with leaden silvery sides and short head. Its snout projects slightly over its upper lip.



Bluntnose minnow (*Pimephales notatus*)
Elongate, tubular body with a broad, bluntly triangular head, and a rounded, blunt snout. A lateral band runs from base of tail to head.



Fathead minnow (*Pimephales promelas*)
Has a relatively short, thick-set body, often with a pronounced belly, a fat head, and a small mouth.



Cutlips minnow (*Exoglossum maxillingua*)
Stout body with a short head and a distinctive 3-lobed jaw. The centre lobe is tongue-like and rests in the upper jaw.



Central mudminnow (*Umbra limi*)
Robust body, flatter beyond the dorsal fin, a prominent vertical bar at the base of the tail.



White sucker (*Catostomus commersoni*)
Torpedo-shaped bodies; large, coarse, white scales; and overhanging, thick fleshy lips, which form a sucker mouth.
